

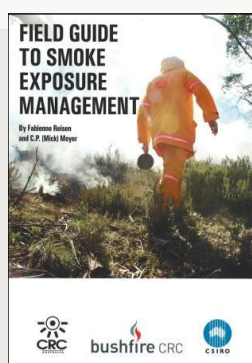

FIELD GUIDE TO SMOKE EXPOSURE MANAGEMENT

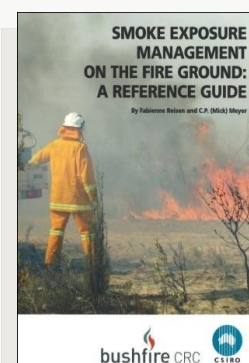

SMOKE EXPOSURE MANAGEMENT ON THE FIRE GROUND — A REFERENCE GUIDE

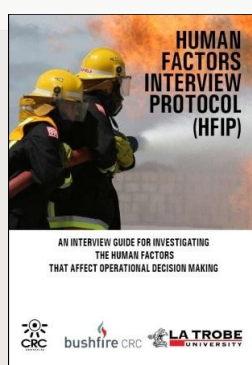

(HFIP) HUMAN FACTORS INTERVIEW PROTOCOL

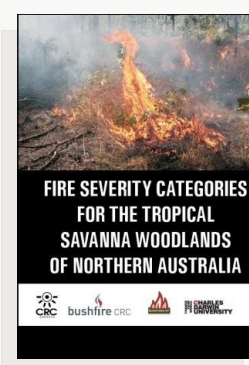
This field guide investigates the human factors that affect operational decision making, and explains how to conduct interviews that elicit high-quality recollections from agency staff about their experiences in the field. It aims to reveal what participants were thinking as they experienced events, and is intended to complement – not replace – other post-incident interview methods.

FIRE IN DRY EUCALYPT FOREST

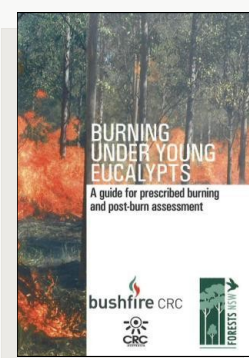
This field guide was developed to provide a systematic method for assessing fuel hazard and predicting potential fire behaviour in dry eucalypt forests in southern Australia, and will assist in making decisions that ensure the protection of fire crews and the community. The guide integrates Project Vesta research findings with the Victorian Overall Fuel Hazard Guide.

BURNING UNDER YOUNG EUCALYPTS: A GUIDE FOR PRESCRIBED BURNING AND POST-BURN ASSESSMENT

This guide was developed to characterise fuels, describe fire behaviour and determine the effect of low to moderate intensity fire on young eucalypt trees. Data was collected between 2005 and 2007 over six sites, two species and three age classes in northern New South Wales.
